## Angling for the Idle but Wild

Many great opportunities await those who fish the Enchanted Circle area. The scenery is a given; but for those who love to walk, pedal or drive, an experience many pay hundreds, if not thousands of dollars for, is right out our back doors. Making new friends, finding a super picnic area or getting to know your grandkids are just a few of the limitless experiences to be had while wetting a hook in the many lakes and streams throughout our corner of New Mexico.

Several beaver ponds and the Gravel Pit lakes are the easiest places to fish from the comfort of a lawn chair. The fly fishers will love the endless nooks, riffles, and undercut banks that can challenge even the most experienced angler.

Several other rivers and streams are within a short drive from Eagle Nest. The Red, Val Vidal (Costilla), and Rio Grande are just a few. The town of Red River is a wonderful place to wet a hook while other members of your party shop, ski, or hang out in the colorful eating establishments. The guys will like Red River.

First on the list is Eagle Nest Lake. Many think that hiring a guide or renting a boat is necessary to lure the big one. While this is a wonderful way to enjoy the view of the valley, I see many guides bank fishing on their days off. By purchasing a can of corn or a container of worms, rainbow trout, salmon, and perch are only a few minutes from the pan or grill.

Second on the list is the Cimarron River. The Cimarron is perhaps the number one blue ribbon trout stream in all of New Mexico. This stream is home to stocked rainbow, wild brook and wild German brown trout. During the summer, the river is stocked with thousands of rainbow. These stocked fish come from the hatchery on the lower Red River below Questa. Brown trout also call the Cimarron home. This species of trout was introduced in the late 19th century to many of the rivers of the west. The brown trout is a leery wild fish which is quite a challenge to hook.

Before setting out on your angling adventure be sure to pick up a copy of the NM Game and Fish rules and regulations. They can be found wherever you purchase a fishing permit. Know the regulations and the area that you are fishing. Some special trout areas are for fly fishing only. A couple of years ago the Director of the New Mexico Game and Fish was cited for elk hunting in the wrong area. He said his GPS malfunctioned. OUCH!!!

Several Idlewild anglers, Don and Jim Herman, Don Reavis, Ron Wells and myself, to name a few, will be glad to share our 1,000 years of combined fishing knowledge and lies (mostly lies) with you. 

### The Alpine Garden

#### Vegetable gardening:

There are several difficulties the mountain gardener must be aware of to increase the chances for a bountiful harvest:


1. Our growing season is extremely short. Frost-free nights last only from about early June through the first week in September.
2. Even during summer, nights are cool (usually in the 40's or 50's) and the soil warms slowly in the spring. Mulching will help keep early plantings protected.
3. Additional irrigation is essential.

These special problems mean that we must be more selective about the types of vegetables grown, and more careful in the selection of varieties.

All types of lettuces do well in our area: spinach too, if started early. Other options for your mountain garden are peas, or even zucchini. If you start early, beets or carrots will grow.

Tomatoes are a little too delicate for our area, as well as cucumbers and corn.

If you take the time to select the right vegetables, and plant according to our plant hardiness zone (Zone 5a and 5b), you should have a bumper crop of veggies to enjoy!

### Idlewild Community Center Use IWCC Property Rental Policies

IWCC's Chapel and Community Center are both available for use by members and nonmembers. All events using either, or both, facilities should be scheduled with Sue Dorr or Frank Dodge. There is no fee for members of the community, or their families, for use of the chapel and Community Center; however, donations are appreciated. If you require help setting up or cleaning up, please determine the appropriate fee with the caretaker. IWCC members may use the tables and chairs at no additional cost. If you require sound, you will need to provide your own, as the community does not have sound equipment available.

Nonmembers should also schedule with Sue Dorr or Frank Dodge, with payment due on the day of the event. The fees are as follows: \$50 for use of the chapel, \$50 for use of the Community Center, and \$75 for the use of both facilities.

### The Alpine Chef

#### Big Bear High Altitude Chocolate Chip Cookies

1 c. butter  
1/2 c. granulated sugar  
3/4 c. brown sugar  
2 tsp. vanilla  
2 eggs  
1/2 tsp. salt  
1 tsp. baking soda  
2 c. (12 oz.) chocolate chips  
2-3 c. flour  
Nuts, if desired



Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Cream butter and sugars until fluffy. Add vanilla and eggs and beat well. Slowly add baking soda and salt. Add flour slowly until batter is too thick to stir further. This will take approximately 2-3 cups of flour. Add chocolate chips and nuts if desired. Bake 8-10 minutes. Makes approximately 3 dozen cookies that will rise tall and thick.
